All are invited to attend the Celebration and Dedication of the new offices of City Hall and the Grand Ledge Police Department on Tuesday, February 18 at 2:00 pm. The office building is the former Greenwood School and entrance to City Hall is from N. Clinton Street and the entrance to the Police Department is from Main Street. Mayor Kalmin Smith states "The City left a building that was converted from a deconsecrated Catholic Church and dedicated as the Grand Ledge City Hall on October 31, 1970. Prior to 1970, the city offices were located at what is now Ledge Craft Lane at the corner of S. Bridge and W. River Streets. That building was first occupied in 1886 and served as the city center until 1970."
