#### Grand Ledge: In the Beginning

As part of the Grand Ledge Area Historical Society's on-going public historical program series, Marilyn Smith long time resident and local historian will narrate a slide presentation of "Grand Ledge: In the Beginning" including shots of the early ledges, fossils, arrowheads, and Chief Okemos from when we were called Big Rocks on Tuesday, April 3, 2012, 7:30 p.m. at the Opera House.

You will see pictures of the first dam and flour mill which were located near the Opera House gardens, meet Rueban Wood who had the first store on the site of the Opera House and Edmund Lamson, the first permanent settler and first village president after we became Grand Ledge.

You will also meet Miss Sanders, the first teacher in the early 1850s and pictures of some of the 1800's schools. Check out the first four churches built in Grand Ledge. Only one still remains today.

Visit early clay pits and coal mines. See the replica of the Russell mine and a coal miner's light. Watch a barn raising and making soap, butter, sauerkraut and maple syrup.

Have you ever seen a rope bed? A Betty Lamp, a coal fired iron? An early hand held hearing amplifier?

Join us to see pictures of and learn about Big Rocks and the early years of Grand Ledge.
