The Grand Ledge Opera House is a historical building in the heart of downtown Grand Ledge that functions as a community building for the greater Grand Ledge area. The Opera House presents concerts and community events such as "Singers on the Grand" the Lansing Theater Organ concerts, Christmas Traditions, St. Patrick's Day and Victorian Day celebrations. It is a venue for musical performances by groups from the Grand Ledge Public Schools. The Opera House is also available for weddings, graduation parties, birthday and anniversary celebrations. The lower level, patio, and grounds along the Grand River are a lovely setting for a party of any kind. The Opera House was renovated for use by the community in 1993 with financial support from organizations and individuals in the community. Help us keep our Grand Ledge community clean and help the environment by participating in our spring Reuse & Recycle Day. Grand Ledge and Oneida Township residents can drop off the following items for reuse, recycling and/or disposal:

The following items will be accepted for RECYCLING at no charge:

Scrap Metal: Common household items comprised primarily of metal. Any gasoline engines are acceptable but all gas and oil must be drained out. Fuel oil or gasoline tanks or cans are acceptable but must be cut in half. Closed metal wate tanks are acceptable but must have a large hole cut in to it. Please note: We cannot accept hydraulic cylinders, propane tanks/bottles, gas cylinders (propane, oxygen, acetylene, etc.). cans which contain paint/stain or chemicals.

Electronic Waste: Computers, TV's, VCR's, etc., mainly speakers and equipment with circuit boards. Please note: We cannot accept appliances which contain refrigerants (refrigerators, dehumidifiers, air conditioners), household appliances that do not contain circuit boards (toasters, blenders, etc.) or anything containing radioactive material (smoke detectors, etc.).

Lead Acid Batteries: Automotive, marine, motorcycle, (etc.) lead acid batteries.

Newspaper: Remove from plastic or paper bags. Remove all string or twine. Inserts are acceptable.

Mixed Residential Mail: Includes catalogs, magazines, direct ("Junk") mail, first class mail and other printing or writing papers, including white or pastel envelopes, and glue bound soft cover books, from residential sources.

Corrugated Cardboard/Brown Paper Bags

Glass Food & Beverage Containers (brown and clear): Rinse clean and remove lids and metal rings. Place metal lids with tin cans. Labels may be left on. Separate by color. NO: Green glass, Window panes, light bulbs, Pyrex, plate glass, automobile glass.

Tin Cans & Aluminum: (Soup cans, aluminum foil & trays). Rinse clean and flatten. NO: paint cans, appliances, hangers, fencing, scrap metal or aerosol cans, containers with food residue.

Mixed Plastic Bottles & Jugs: #1 PET or PETE, #2 HDPE, #3 V (Vinyl) or PVC, #7. NO: #6 plastic.

C.F.L.'s Polystyrene (Styrofoam) Used Cooking Oil Household Batteries

The following items will be accepted for Reuse at no charge:

Usable Clothing, Furniture and Household Items: Salvation Army will be at the event to collect common household items that are in usable condition. For guidelines on items to donate, please visit their website www.usc.salvationarmy.org/wmni or call a local store.

Cell Phones: We will collect your old cell phones (don't forget the cell phone charger) and donate it to Eaton County Siren Shelter to help victims of domestic violence.
