## EATON COUNTY PARKS DEPARTMENT

The annual awarding of Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund grants on December 7, 2011 has a very positive impact on Eaton County units of government as Dimondale, Grand Ledge and Eaton Rapids were successful in their applications. With a strong emphasis on water based recreation access to Michigan rivers and streams, all three communities scored high in their proposals to provide improved and new access to the Grand River. Subject to various adjustments, Dimondale was awarded \$169,900 to improve Island Park, Grand Ledge will receive \$138,800 for the Jaycee Park Boat Launch and Eaton Rapids obtained the maximum development grant of \$300,000 for the Mill Street Landing improvements. Local awards totaled \$608,700 in this competitive grant program, which matches local funds on a 3/1 minimum basis. MNRTF grants are administered by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for development and acquisition projects for park and recreation projects. Neighboring communities also received grants including Lake Odessa (Beach Development, \$200,000), Hastings (Riverwalk Trail Extensions, \$244,900), and Delhi Township (North Trail Connector, \$300,000).St. Johns, Pewamo, Ionia County and Aurelius Township had unsuccessful applications, but were encouraged to re-apply in the next round of consideration with project submissions due on March 1, 2012.MNRTF was established in 1976 by the voters to amend the Constitution to place oil and gas royalties into a Trust Fund to re-invest in natural resources, land acquisition and development projects for local governments and State agencies. The grant-in-aid program was modeled after the Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund of 1964 which provided 50/50 matching fund grants to local and State units. MDNR also administers In the best interest of local communities and a high priority for collaboration and cooperation efforts, the Eaton County Parks Department supplied endorsement letters for the successful projects at Eaton Rapids, Grand Ledge and Dimondale. Congratulations to all involved is in order.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKI AND SNOWSHOE RENTALS AT FITZGERALD PARK: Eaton County Parks is again offering cross-country ski and snowshoe rentals at Fitzgerald Park in Grand Ledge this winter season. The Park office is open for rentals from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays only through the end of December. Weekend rentals (weather permitting) will start after the first of the year. Cost to rent equipment is \$5 per hour, \$15 per day, or \$50 for a weekend (weekend rate is from Friday afternoon to Monday noon). Cross-country ski rental includes skis, poles, and boots. A picture ID is required for rentals. Rental equipment is available in both children and adult sizes. MasterCard, Visa, and Discover cards accepted.

NATURE AT NIGHT - SNOWSHOE OWL PROWL: Register now to reserve your pair of snowshoes or bring your own and join Eaton County Parks Naturalist Jackie Blanc on a night hike through the winter wonderland in search of screech owls, looking for animal tracks, and making a few of our own. A series of Nature at Night hikes will be held from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. on the following Wednesday evenings: January 4, January 18, February 1, February 15, and March 14. All hikes will be held at Lincoln Brick Park located just north of Grand Ledge on Tallman Road. Program fee is \$5 per person with equipment rental or \$2 per person with your own equipment (reduced youth group rate is available). If there is not sufficient snow cover for snowshoeing, a night walk will be held instead for a cost of \$2 per person or \$5 per family.
