This is the 30th year that the all-volunteer group, ages 4 to 84!, will take to the stage; singers, dancers, musicians and comedians, a cast of over 100 kids and adults. The theme for 2010 is "Back to Broadway", featuring old and new song hits from many musicals, including "The Lion King", "Oklahoma", "Spamalot", "South Pacific", and "Chicago". "The Bums" (Grand Ledge's answer to the Sons of The Pioneers, the Beach Boys and the Blues Brothers) will be there with tunes from "Jersey Boys". As always, the show will end with the Patriotic Finale, honoring all of our veterans, and the singing of our hymn to liberty "God Bless America".

All proceeds will go to the Grand Ledge Emergency Assistance Program (GLEAP), which provides help for families in our school district who are having trouble in tough economic times.

<u>Pileated Woodpecker Program</u>—The large impressive Pileated Woodpecker, considered extinct for decades in the greater Lansing area, has undergone a remarkable resurgence and has been successfully breeding at Lincoln Brick Park along the Grand River for the past several years. Join Friends of Eaton County Parks member and active Michigan Audubon Society Board member John Baumgartner on Saturday, June 12, at 10am at the Lincoln Brick Park Interpretive Center as he shares his insights and knowledge from his documented studies of this massive woodpecker along with information about its habitat and communities. Participants are welcome to join in a bird walk directly following the presentation (weather permitting). Sturdy walking shoes, field guides and binoculars are recommended for those interested in participating in the walk. Program fee is \$3 per adult, \$2 per child 12 and under, or \$8 per family.
