- ~The state stone is the Petoskey Stone, found along the shores of Lake Michigan.
- ~The city of Novi was named from its designation as Stagecoach Stop #6 or No.VI
- ~ The painted turtle is Michigan's state reptile.
- ~Michigan has the longest freshwater shoreline in the world.
- ~Michigan has more than 11,000 inland lakes and more than 36,000 miles of streams
- ~Michigan has 116 lighthouses and navigational lights
- ~Isle Royale Park shelters one of the largest moose herds remaining in the US
- ~Michigan State University has the largest single campus student body of any Michigan university. It is the largest institution of higher learning in the state and one of the largest in the country.
- ~In 1817 the University of Michigan was the first university established by any of the states. Originally named Cathelepistemian and located in Detroit, the name was changed in 1821 and moved to Ann Arbor in 1841.
- ~Michigan is the only place in the world with a floating post office. The JW West-cott II is the only boat in the world that delivers mail to ships while they are still underway. They have been operating for 125 years.
- ~Four flags have flown over Michigan-French, English, Spanish, and US

Calling All Crafters— The Friends of Eaton County Parks are looking for people interested in exhibiting their crafts at the 22nd Annual Ledges Classic Auto and Craft Show on Saturday, July 9, 2011, from 9am to 4pm. More information and a registration form are available on the website.

Annual Park Passes on Sale Now— An annual 2011 park pass would make an ideal gift for the dog walker, hiker, or nature lover. Resident annual pass is \$20 (\$15 for senior citizens); non-resident \$25 (\$20 for senior citizens). Annual passes are valid from January 1—December 31, 2011.

Fox Park Public Observatory-Everyone is invited to join us this winter at the Fox Park Observatory for public viewing nights on the following dates: May 20-21, 9:30-11:30pm; June 10-11, 9:30-11:30pm. Local amateur astronomers Kevin Keys and/or Jason Blaschka will be on hand to answer questions about the night sky. Observation nights will not be held on nights with more than 30% cloud cover. Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family payable at donation box on site. You may call the Observatory at (517) 645-6666 during public viewing hours to check sky conditions.

Breakfast With The Birds— Bring your family and friends to learn the basics of bird watching and bird identification during Breakfast with the Birds Saturday, May 14, 7:30am-10am at Lincoln Brick Park, just north of Grand Ledge. A continental breakfast will be provided by the Friends of Eaton County Parks for all participants. Sturdy walking shoes, field guides and binoculars are recommended. Program cost is \$4 per person and advance registration is required.

Beading Workshop-Come join us for a Beading Workshop Saturday, May 14, 10:30am-12:30pm at the Lincoln Brick Park Interpretive Center. Participants will have the option to make either a beaded bracelet or a beaded necklace for themselves or as a gift for a loved one! Program is appropriate for adults and children. Young children (ages 3-6) may need some assistance from a parent. Cost is \$6 per bracelet/necklace and advance registration is required.

Wildflower Walks— Come explore the wonders of nature as you wander through the woods in search of wildflowers with Park Naturalist Jackie Blanc on the following dates: May 4, 6pm, Lincoln Brick Interpretive Center; May 12, 6pm, meet at Fitzgerald Park Nature Center; May 17, 6pm, Bennett Park Ranger Station. Walks are suitable for all ages. Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family. A reduced youth rate is available.

Spring Splash Canoe Trip-Load up your canoe or kayak and join the Park Naturalist Sunday, May 15, for a three hour excursion down the Grand River from Delta Mills Park to Fitzgerald Park while taking in the sights and sounds of spring. Participants will meet and launch at 1pm. Individuals are encouraged to bring snacks, water and warm clothes. The crew will be arriving at Fitzgerald Park at approximately 4pm and will have the opportunity to tour the Fitzgerald Park Nature Center while waiting for a shuttle back to the launch point at Delta Mills Park for those who need it. The Parks Department has a limited supply of canoes available for use at a cost of \$10 per person. Program fee is \$5 per person with your own canoe or kayak. Advanced registration is required.

2011 Summer Environmental Youth Programs —Join Eaton County Parks Naturalaist Jackie Blanc for an exciting, educational summer of fun and adventure. Activities range from one to five day adventures as well as an overnight field trip. Each adventure will begin at the Interpretive Center at Lincoln Brick Park except for the African Safari overnight field trip to Binder Park Zoo. Registration deadline is May 1, 2011. Hazel Ridge Farm Experience-one day field trip, June 15, July 21, August 22; Wildlife Rehabilitation-one day field trip, July 11, July 20; Binder Park Zoo-African Safari—two day overnight field trip, June 17-18, July 22-23, August

12-13; US Forest Service-Jr. Ranger Program-three day sessions, June 28-30, August 9-11; Go Green-Sustainability Weeks—four to five days sessions, June 20-24, July 5-8, August 1-5.
