








It looks like Spring is here and we are finalizing our plans for our Summer festivals.

From the Desk of the Director: 2012-A New Era

With another weather related season pending this summer, the nine Eaton County Parks will see some dramatic changes for our visitors.

Annual motor vehicle passes are now transferable from vehicle to vehicle, so families can visit and enjoy Eaton County Parks without worrying about the "sticker" being on the "other" vehicle. This "user friendly" approach will encourage more park usage.

Previously purchased non-transferable annual passes will be exchanged at the gatehouse at your first visit, as we anticipate over 145 days of primary use at Lincoln Brick, Fox and Fitzgerald Parks. Annual and daily passes will permit visitors to enjoy several special events, also.

Included in the 2012 calendar at Fitzgerald Park is vehicle admission to Rock The World June 30 and July 1, the Friends Ledges Classic Auto and Craft Show July 14, Run and Play for Ariana kid's festival August 25, the Ford Mustang Car Show August 26, the September 3 Annual Labor Day Bridge Walk, the Grand Adventure Race September 30, and the Capital Area Humane Society Walk/Run for the Animals fundraiser October 6.

As other special events are scheduled, public service announcements will add them to the "pass" calendar. Disc golf tournaments are included in the passes on October 7 and 20-21 at Fitzgerald Park. All in all, the Eaton County motor vehicle passes support over 160 dates in our 2012 calendar, as well as free entry at the Keehne Environmental Area, Butler and Dyer Kiln Parks in Bellevue, the Thornapple Trail in Vermontville, and the Tirrell Roadside Park and the Optimist Youth Camp near Charlotte.

While all nine Eaton County Parks continue to operate on a dawn to dusk basis, hours may be limited for gate attendants to collect vehicle entry fees. Self-pay drop boxes are being designed and placed to permit visitors to support the operations of the entire system year round.

Group functions and special events continue to remain attractive at Fox, Lincoln Brick and Fitzgerald Parks. Reservations are strongly suggested to reserve prime dates and special sites. For more information, call 517-627-7351.
