#### ECP 3RD Annual Labor Day Bridge Walk A Huge Success

# Garden Club Recognition Fitzgerald Park Entrance Garden



#### **COLOR CRUISE LEDGES TOURS**

Take a special Color Cruise Festival one-way ride on the river boat from Island Park to Fitzgerald Park on Saturday, October 12, and Sunday, October 13, at 1:30 p.m. Join Park Naturalist, Jackie Blanc, as she describes scenic and historic sights on the cruise and narrates the walk back along the Ledges Trail. Interested participants will board the river boat at Island Park in downtown Grand Ledge for a 30-minute one-way boat ride to Fitzgerald Park. Once at the park, individuals will have an opportunity to explore the Nature Center and join the Naturalist for the 45-minute historic walk back along the Ledges Trail to Island Park. Cost for the special one-way boat ride is \$4 per person. There is no charge for the guided walk on the Ledges. Boat tour tickets may be purchased at Island Park during the Color Cruise Festival weekend—October 11, 12, and 13.

#### **FOX PARK OBSERVATORY - COMET WATCH 2013**

With Comet C20012 ISON's highly anticipated approach this fall, the Fox Park Observatory will be hosting special dusk 'til dawn Comet Viewing/Astrophotography Nights on the following Saturdays: October 5, November 2, and December 7. The Observatory will be open from 7 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. on these special viewing dates, weather permitting. Comet ISON is on a very predictable path through space but how bright this comet will become is still a mystery. ISON will be passing by Mars around the beginning of October and then will just graze the sun (passing within 1.1 million miles of the sun's surface) around Thanksgiving, which may give us a clue of what magnitude is in store for this comet. If ISON survives its near brush with the sun, it will round the sun and reemerge in December. ISON is not considered an extremely big comet, estimated at no larger than a two kilometer radius, but comet brightness is not synonymous with size. Brightness is frequently associated with the composition of the dusts and density of the gases that make up the comet and the effect solar winds and radiation have on these dusts and gases. Regardless of magnitude it appears that the best time to get a glimpse of this object will be in the eastern sky in the early morning hours, just prior to sunrise.

The Observatory, located at 3979 E. Gresham Hwy. just north of Potterville, is an open air facility. Please dress for the weather and wear sturdy footwear for the 200 yard walk to the Observatory. Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family, payable on site. Comet viewing nights are weather dependent and will not be held on nights with more than 30% cloud cover. You may call the Observatory at 517-645-6666 during public viewing hours to check sky conditions.

#### FAMILY BICYCLE COLOR TOURS

ECP extends an invitation to join the 27th Annual Family Bicycle Color Tours on Saturday, October 12, 2013. Two tour routes are available. The first leaves from Fitzgerald Park in Grand Ledge at 10 a.m. and travels to the Country Mill on Otto Rd. This is a 12 mile one-way ride or a 24 mile round trip. The second ride departs from Fox Park in Potterville at 11 a.m. This is a 4-mile round trip ride to the Country Mill. Advance registration is recommended. Cost for the Fitzgerald Park ride is \$3 per adult, \$2 per child 12 and under, or \$8 per family. Cost for the Fox Park ride is \$2 per person or \$8 per family. You may wish to bring additional money to purchase items at the Country Mill. For more information or to register for the ride, please visit.

### BENNETT PARK FALL FOLIAGE WALK

The public is invited to join the ECP Naturalist for a fall foliage walk at Bennett Park in Charlotte on Tuesday, October 15, at 5:30 p.m. This is an excellent opportunity for individuals, families, and youth groups to experience the magnificent colors of Michigan's woodlands and learn about the flora and fauna of Eaton County. Interested participants should meet at the front parking lot by the restrooms. This program is suitable for all ages. Cost for the walk is \$2 per person or \$5 per family. Program fee is collected on site and exact change is appreciated. A reduced youth group rate is available. Advance registration is recommended.

#### FOX PARK OBSERVATORY - SOLAR VIEWING PROGRAMS

Come out to Fox Park Observatory on the following Sundays – October 13, November 10, and December 15 from 1 to 3 p.m. to view our closet star - the Sun. Participants will use a solar scope and filters to safely view the Sun's surface, spying spots and solar flares. The Observatory, located at 3979 E. Gresham Hwy. just north of Potterville, is an open air facility. Please dress for the weather and wear sturdy footwear for the 200 yard walk to the Observatory. Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family, payable on site

## FOX PARK OBSERVATORY - PUBLIC VIEWING DATES

Public viewing nights will be held at Eaton County's Fox Park Observatory, weather permitting, from 7 to 11 p.m. on the following Saturdays: October 12, 19, and 26; November 9 and 23; and December 14. The Observatory, located at 3979 E. Gresham Hwy., just north of Potterville, is an open air observatory. Please dress appropriately for the weather and wear sensible footwear for the 200 yard walk to the observatory. Public observation nights are suitable for people of all ages but are not held on nights with more than 30% cloud cover. You may call the Observatory at 517-645-6666 during public viewing hours to check on sky conditions. Program fee is \$2 per person or \$5 per family, payable on site.
