Congratulations to Terrance Augustine – Grand Ledge Farmers Market <u>www.glfarm.org</u> East Lansing, Grand Ledge, Delhi Twp. Get \$60,000 in State Grants for Farmer Markets

Three area communities are among 10 statewide approved for state grants to improve their farmers markets. East Lansing was awarded \$35,000 for a covered plaza for the market and other events; Grand Ledge will receive \$15,000 for a multi-use building along the river and Delhi Township was awarded \$10,000 to create a community kitchen intended to expand the market into a yearround event and to provide space for community events such as wine tastings. The Grand Ledge project could also be used as an ice rink and space for community events. The awards were announced by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation after Michigan Strategic Fund approval of \$200,000 in grants for 10 farmers markets around the state. "Farmers markets improve our downtowns and bring vitality and a sense of place to our communities," said MEDC President and CEO Michael A. Finney. "These grants will support local markets, strengthen communities and create jobs in our state." In addition to the local markets awards were granted to Gladstone, Marquette, Boyne City, Port Sanilac, Gaylord, Chelsea and Canton Township. The winning projects will provide \$269,450 in matching funds. Locally, East Lansing is to match with \$35,000; Grand Ledge will contribute \$25,000 and Delhi will contribute \$10,140.78. Announced in June, the Farmers Market Grant Program provides one-time grants between \$10,000 and \$50,000 to existing farmers markets that have been in operation for at least four years in Michigan. Projects for consideration included unique and innovative design elements, amenities for patrons and vendors, multi-use spaces, multi-modal transportation, marketing and signage. Projects that make markets more accessible to residents were also given preference. A total of 24 applications requesting \$677,904 were submitted to the 2013 Farmers Market Grant Program, Representatives from the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development and the Michigan Farmers Market Association participated on the scoring team. "Michigan's community farmers markets have helped re-energize the enthusiasm for connecting with our agricultural roots. As a matter of fact, Michigan ranks fourth in the nation for the number of farmers markets," said Jamie Clover Adams, Director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development. "Our farmers markets are a great place to sample the diversity of our agriculture and get a taste of Pure Michigan." A second round of food entrepreneurship grants, this one aimed at the food truck industry in Michigan, will be announced within the next two to three weeks. Pure Michigan is a brand on the rise, representing business, talent and tourism initiatives across Michigan. These efforts are driven by the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, which serves as the state's marketing arm and lead agency for business growth, jobs and opportunity with a focus on helping grow Michigan's economy.

Friends of Eaton County Parks Grant Award

The Friends of Eaton County Parks was presented a \$5,000 grant from the Tri-County Regional Planning project to involve Eaton County residents in updating the Five-Year Recreation Plan. The grant is administered by the Mid-Michigan Environmental Action Council and authorized Eaton County to proceed in the project to renew the Plan that was initiated in 2009. The Friends organization, a

501.c.3 non-profit organization, is the primary recipient. The grant will bring various underrepresented and underserved citizens into the development of the extended Parks Plan. The Friends have been asked to include students, veterans and senior citizens in the process. It is anticipated that public meetings, surveys and preferential discussions will be part of the planning process.


